


MUKHABARAT



Iraq's Facilitation of Authoritarian Control via a Complex System of Multiple, Overlapping Security Organizations



MUKHABARAT was Irag's security

apparatus under Saddam Hussein. The five primary agencies of Mukhabarat are pictured below. These separate yet overlapping agencies worked to protect Saddam, prevent coups, and "maintain internal domestic security and conduct foreign affairs" (al-Marashi, 2002). Along with these agencies, the Ba'ath party and select units of the military worked to ensure Saddam's safety and that "every aspect of Iraqi life" was under Saddam's complete and total control (al-Marashi, 2002).

FACILITATION OF AUTHORITARIAN CONTROL

- GENERAL SECURITY "monitor[ed] the day-to-day lives of the population, creating a pervasive local presence" (al-Marashi, 2002).
- MILITARY INTELLIGENCE "ensure[d] the loyalty of the military and gather[ed] military intelligence" (al-Marashi, 2002).
- MILITARY SECURITY is tasked with "internal security and detecting dissention in the armed forces" (al-Marashi, 2002).
- SPECIAL SECURITY "suppress[ed] domestic opposition to the regime" (al-Marashi, 2002).
- The main task of GENERAL INTELLIGENCE was the "infiltration of anti-regime organizations, such the Iraqi National Accord, an opposition group based in Jordan" (al-Marashi 2002).
